

# Women's Foundation of Oklahoma Grantees 2004 – 2008

## **Boys & Girls Club of Oklahoma County \$5,875**

To purchase infant simulators to implement in its "Smart Girls" curriculum with young girls at the inner-city McKinley Center.

## **Community Action Project of Tulsa County \$15,000**

To provide licenses for seven Tulsa Agencies enabling each agency to utilize the Benefits Eligibility System for Oklahomans.

## **Domestic Violence Intervention Services (Tulsa) \$6,000**

To provide a joint research project with the University of Oklahoma's Applied Research Program to evaluate the relationship between emotional intelligence and behavioral change readiness of batterers.

## **Family & Children's Services (Tulsa) \$10,000**

To adapt and implement CHOICES curriculum for programs serving Hispanic girls ages 6 - 14.

## **Family Shelter of Southern Oklahoma \$10,000**

To expand their service delivery to Love County providing legal advocacy, violence education, job placement, and more.

## **Friends of Eddie Warrior (Women's Correctional Facility in Taft) \$1,000**

To support an educational program for incarcerated women with possible replication in other correctional facilities.

## **Girl Scouts of Magic Empire Council (Tulsa) \$10,000 & \$10,000**

To expand the Girl Scout program at Turley Correctional Center to Hillside and Eddie Warrior Correctional Centers. To support a new re-entry component for their program to help with life after release.

## **Girl Scouts of Western Oklahoma \$10,000**

To fund programming and community capacity building in five rural areas.

## **Housing Partners of Tulsa \$1,600**

To provide curriculum materials for girls programs at each of Tulsa's public housing sites.

## **Institute for Women's Policy Research (statewide) \$1,000**

Sponsorship of study on women's issues specific to Oklahoma as part of a nationwide research project targeting particular regions of the U.S. each year.

## **Langston University (statewide) \$5,000**

To develop a model program to serve single mothers in order that they may attend and complete college.

## **Law Project (statewide) \$10,000**

Engaging law schools, legal clinics, and women's organizations in Oklahoma in preparation of a treatise identifying and summarizing Oklahoma laws, statutes, & judicial opinions impacting women and girls.

## **Legal Aid Services of Oklahoma (statewide) \$14,500**

To summarize the 2004 Law Project and (1) to compile, summarize, and publish all Oklahoma laws affecting women and (2) publish an inventory of all resources available to Oklahoma women.

## **New Hope Camp (Tulsa) \$10,000**

To implement "Girls Circle" curriculum in providing programs in the Tulsa area for preteen and teenage girls who have a parent in prison.

## **Norman Alcohol Information Center (El Reno) \$5,000**

To develop needs assessment and obtain gender specific data related to the needs of female adolescents in El Reno regarding substance abuse and related risk behaviors.

## **Northwest Domestic Crisis Services (Alva, Guymon, Seiling, Woodward) \$2,000**

Capacity building grant to provide organization with a planning consultant to assist in needs assessment, grant proposal planning, and developing community linkages.

## **Northwest Domestic Crisis Services (Alva) \$6,200**

To equip computer lab for women in domestic violence shelter for use as they attend NWOSU in Alva.

## **Oklahoma Alliance of Girl Scouts (statewide) \$10,000**

To convene the eight Girl Scout councils serving Oklahoma to build on efficiencies through collaborative efforts and frame strategies for sharing resources.

## **Oklahoma Council on Economic Education (statewide) \$15,000**

To expand financial literacy training to create programs in alternative schools, correctional facilities, and Smart Start communities.

## **Oklahoma Institute for Child Advocacy (statewide) \$5,000**

Research and education project focusing on comprehensive teen pregnancy prevention strategies for dissemination to service/program providers, policy makers, and local coalitions.

## **Oklahoma Native American Legal Resources (statewide) \$5,000**

To provide legislative advocacy training and building of a grassroots organization for Native American women.

## **Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education on behalf of SMART: Single Mothers Academic Resource Team (statewide) \$9,775**

To fund materials of a research project assessing the barriers and challenges faced by single mother students at seven Oklahoma regional universities and community colleges.

## **Oklahoma Women's Coalition \$10,000**

To fund the infrastructure of the new organization advancing the issues facing women and girls through legislative education and action.

## **Planned Parenthood of Arkansas and Eastern Oklahoma \$7,369**

To purchase equipment necessary to begin providing low income women access to the new, less invasive tubal ligation procedure.

## **Planned Parenthood of Central Oklahoma \$9,731**

To improve technology infrastructure with purchase of "Get Active" communication service, computers, and presentation equipment.

## **Resonance/FORCE (Tulsa) \$4,000**

To provide technical assistance through an advocacy consultant to assist in focusing board on change initiatives such as voting rights and revocation of cosmetology licenses.

## **Rose State College Foundation (statewide) \$11,600**

To purchase distance learning equipment necessary to continue providing educational programming and college classes to women in Mabel Bassett Correctional Center.

## **Teen Outreach Program in Grant High School & Emerson Alternative School (Oklahoma City) \$2,500**

Grant to help fund curriculum focusing on life skills, career development, and health issues facing teenage mothers.

## **Wichita Mountains Prevention Network (Lawton) \$6,000**

To expand Girl Power programs into Lawton middle schools.

## **YWCA (Ardmore, Enid, Oklahoma City, Tulsa) \$10,000**

To fund a convening planned and executed by the staffs of the four YWCAs to share successful programs, develop collaborative opportunities, and explore potential of statewide projects and/or shared staff.

## **SPECIAL PROJECT: Citizens Policy Center (statewide) \$15,000**

To create policy report focusing on evaluating the current status of economic opportunities in Oklahoma and providing policy solutions to improve individuals' economic self-sufficiency.
